

Agenda Notes 3rd February 2020

The Chairperson welcomed and thanked the 39 residents who attended. Also in attendance were representatives from Kate McCarthy, Garda Siochana, Gary Mulcahy UCC and Shane Fagan Scholarlee along with Cllrs Colette Finn and Thomas Moloney. Apologies received from Cllrs Henry Cremin, Mick Finn & Garret Kelleher.

Chairperson asked that a motion of condolence be passed to the family of the late Cameron Blair on their son's recent tragic death. The chairperson stated students are all part of our local community and his tragic death had a huge impact on all residents.

A brief summary followed on the associations Annual Report with copies of the report distributed to all.

The committee then outlined the details of their meeting with An Garda Siochana (Supt. Colm O'Sullivan and his team) earlier in the day where we highlighted our concerns on the upcoming Rag Week event in UCC which is due to start on Sun 9th Feb and continue to Fri 14th.

An Garda Siochana, and UCC gave presentations and advice to the residents on their plans for the event. Lengthy discussions on the event then followed. Cllrs also informed the meeting of City Council's Joint Policing Committee which was also held earlier in the day with the emphasis again being on increased policing.

Cllrs also informed the meeting of City Council's plan for the proposed development of the former Ryans Garage site running between Magazine & Glasheen Roads. This will be a social housing project comprising of one and two bed apartments and will be advertised in the coming weeks.

There followed a short discussion on the planning application for the former Riordans Joinery site on Bandon Rd, with a decision due from An Bord Pleanala on Feb 10th.

Due to the lengthy discussions on Rag Week, it was decided that the other items on the agenda should be deferred until the next meeting and the chairperson again thanked all for their attendance.
